## Government's Autumn Statement - Reduction in National Insurance from 6 January 2024

## Impact on net pay from January 2024

The Government's Autumn Statement announced a reduction of 2% in Employees National Insurance contributions up to £4,189 per month from 6 January 2024.

Generally, if you pay National Insurance on your earnings, this will mean that your net pay will rise.

From 6 January 2024 National Insurance Contributions based on your earnings will be calculated as follows:

- No national insurance payable if you earn less than £1048 per month
- 10% (a decrease from 12%) on earnings between £1,048 and £4,189 a month
- 2% on income over £4,189 a month

## Impact on Salary Sacrifice Schemes

Employees who participate in the Council's salary sacrifice schemes (including Shared Cost Additional Voluntary Contributions, Cycle to Work and Childcare Vouchers) will not need to make any changes to their deductions. Employees may however notice a change in the amount of National Insurance savings they make.
