Online Staff Prevent Awareness Training for Education

These sessions cover all of the important issues that staff need to know for Prevent (What is Prevent?, What is radicalisation? Case study example, Common signs of vulnerability & radicalisation, Current threat level & the main risks from terrorism & extremism).

The session is suitable for all education sector organisations but is particularly useful for smaller organisations who may struggle to provide a more detailed Prevent input to smaller staff cohorts. You can use this training for new staff in all education-based organisations or for those staff who need a more detailed insight or update.

Southport Attack and Ensuing Riots

The horrific attack in Southport this summer, which resulted in the deaths of three young girls, was a lesson in how quickly the far-right can mobilise supporters and attempt to cause disturbances across the country. It was heartening to see that there were more counter-demonstrations across Derbyshire than actual disturbances, but these events may have left some students feeling insecure, frightened, angry or upset. This is a good opportunity to check in with colleagues and pupils about how they are feeling and

coping. We are still waiting to see if the demonstrations and sentiments regarding disinformation will result in an increase in Prevent referrals. We are here to talk through any concerns you may have with you, so feel free to call or email our team.
